

Permit Regulations Checklist

Raised fire pans and toilet systems are required YEAR ROUND.

- You will not be sent anything in the mail or email for payment or permit confirmation.**
- The permit will be issued ONLY on the day of launch in person at Rand.**
- Permit check-in is 7:00 am - 2:00 pm on the launch date only. If you fail to check in by 2:00, your permit is void, will be recorded as a no-show, and the spaces will be given away.
- If **cancelling the entire permit**, the deadline is **the day before launch by 3pm**. Cancellations can be made by phone, fax, or email. If you fail to contact this office by the deadline, you will be recorded as a no-show and will be unable to control a permit the rest of this year and all of next year, including the lottery.
- The Party Leader must be at least 18 years old by the launch date.
- The Party Leader is required to watch the Rogue River Permit video once per year (available on our website above).
- On most waterways, including the Recreation Section of the Rogue River, Oregon State Law requires a Waterway Access Permit for all non-motorized boats ten feet long or longer. This permit is **NOT** required on the Wild Section of the Rogue River (exemption for 'a federally designated wild and scenic river for which a separate fee system is in place.'). These permits are not available at this office.
- Oregon Law requires each boater to have U.S. Coast Guard Type I, III or V PFD. All boaters are required to wear them in Class III or greater rapids, children age 12 and under must wear a PFD at all times while on the water.
- Check-in requirements:
 - Picture ID for Party Leader only
 - Names and addresses of additional party members
 - The types and colors of your craft
 - Toilet system
- Toilet Systems must be easily accessible for inspection at check-in.
 - Large enough to accommodate your entire group for the entire length of your trip
 - Dedicated system and cannot be used to store supplies, is reusable, washable, watertight, and has a screw on or latching gasketed lid.
 - Approved pouch toilet systems: Biffy Bags, Clean Waste bags, RESTOP2 bags. If you will be using these you are required to bring a water tight container to store the used pouches in.
- All party members on the permit must be below Grave Cr. Falls by midnight on the launch date and camp or lodge together each night on the entire trip.
- Two launches are allowed per permitted group on the launch date, but each subgroup must have an official copy of the permit, a separate toilet system, and meet up to camp or lodge.

- **Current fire regulations: [Extreme/High/Medium/Low/Off-Season]** Fire restrictions may change, updates are available on our website and the current regulations will be reviewed when you check in.

Fire Regulations

Raised fire pans and toilet systems are required YEAR ROUND.

HIGH:

- **NO WOOD BURNING FIRES.**
- Gas and propane stoves are permitted for cooking purposes ONLY.
- Smoking is allowed on the water, sand and gravel bars.
- Cooking, and smoking areas must be **naturally** free of flammable vegetation and below high water mark.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Each group must carry a shovel and a bucket (1gallon minimum).

MEDIUM:

- **NO WOOD BURNING FIRES.**
- Gas and propane stoves or charcoal briquettes in a raised firepan are permitted for cooking ONLY.
- Smoking is allowed on the water, sand and gravel bars.
- Cooking, and smoking areas must be **naturally** free of flammable vegetation and below high water mark.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Each group must carry a shovel and a bucket (1gallon minimum).

LOW:

- Campfires are allowed in raised fire pans on sand and gravel bars below high water mark.
- Smoking is allowed on the water, sand and gravel bars below high water mark.
- Campfires, cooking, and smoking areas must be **naturally** free of flammable vegetation.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Each group must carry a shovel and a bucket (1gallon minimum).

Off-Season:

- All open fires within 400' of the river's edge must be contained in a firepan.
- All ashes, charcoal, and unburned material must be hauled out.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
