Resolution 14-02  
April 24, 2014

*The following resolution was approved by a quorum of council members present during a vote at the April 24, 2014 council meeting held in Fairbanks, Alaska. Council chair Peter Fix presiding. The resolution was forwarded to BLM State Director Bud Cribley.*

WHEREAS, human waste, litter, and fire ring management has become a problem along the Gulkana Wild and Scenic River; and

WHEREAS, the 2006 Gulkana River Plan set thresholds for implementation of adaptive management to address these issues; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) conducted surveys from 2007 to 2012 and found that the thresholds pertaining to human waste, litter, and fire ring management were exceeded; and

WHEREAS, BLM launched an aggressive outreach effort to address these problems; and

WHEREAS, said thresholds continue to be exceeded;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the BLM Resource Advisory Council supports the implementation of special rules for human waste, fire ring management, and litter for the Gulkana Wild and Scenic River.

Certification

The foregoing resolution was adopted by the BLM-Alaska Resource Advisory Council by a vote of 9 in favor, 1 opposed, and 5 not present.
