Appendix 1: Special Status Species Rank Definitions

Below are the global (G) and subnational (S) rank definitions found on the NatureServe website (Table 1). Global refers to the known global population and subnational refers to state or province. There may be qualifiers for each rank referring to a specific type of habitat (Table 2). More detailed information about ranking can be found on the NatureServe or Nevada Division of Natural Heritage website. Species status specific to the Nevada Department of Wildlife, Wildlife Action Plan (Draft 2022) and Nevada Division of Forestry can be found in Table 3. Federal listing status for species and associated habitat determined by the US Fish and Wildlife Service can be found in Table 4.

Where global or state ranks appear secure for a sensitive species or a species is not ranked in this document, the taxon has met at least one of the following criteria on BLM administered lands:

1. Taxa with a global rank of G3 or below.
2. Taxa with a state rank of S3 or below.
3. Taxa with a trinomial rank of T3 or below.
4. Taxa have stressors/threats and/or declining population trends.
5. Taxa on BLM-administered lands negatively affected by changes in water quality or quantity.
6. Endemism – taxa occurring in a single geographic location (e.g., spring/spring complex, valley, mountain range), and thus, have a higher risk of extinction/extirpation.

Critical Habitat	Specific areas within the geographic area determined by USFWS, occupied by the species at the time it was listed, that contain the physical or biological features that are essential to the conservation of endangered and threatened species and that may need special management or protection.
