This summer, the Redding Field Office had a full complement of campground hosts to keep things running smoothly in our campgrounds. We offer a small daily stipend to our campground hosts - but they are invaluable in the work we do! They keep things clean, ensure visitors are following campground rules, monitor campfires, and interact with visitors. This year we had 13,113 "visitor days" at our 4 campgrounds – our campground hosts likely interacted with each of these campground visitors.
