

Red Cliffs NCA Rehabilitation

Amount Expended: \$38,000

The BLM's St. George Field Office (SGFO) used fee revenues to complete a large-scale landscape rehabilitation project along the Red Reef Trail in the Red Cliffs National Conservation Area. This project included the construction of erosion control features, planting 400 native plants, dispersing 300 pounds of native seeds, installing signage, and revamping the trailhead. These improvements will enhance wildlife habitat, slow erosion, and improve the overall visitor experience.

Bearclaw Poppy Trail Improvement

Amount Expended: \$27,000

The SGFO used fee revenues to protect habitat for the endangered dwarf bear poppy in the vicinity of the Bearclaw Poppy Trail. The project included the construction of a wood rail fence along sections of the trail, the rehabilitation of social trails, and the installation of navigational signage. These improvements will help visitors better navigate the trail and avoid off-trail travel, thereby protecting sensitive habitat.

General setting for the Revenant Trail System.

- Development of the Revenant Trail System in western Washington County (\$400,000).
- Replacement of dilapidated picnic tables at Baker Dam Campground (\$20,000).
- Funding janitorial and toilet pumping services for recreational facilities (\$122,000).
- Approximately \$200,000 will be spent on staff salaries.
- Development and installation of informational panels and signage (\$5,000)
