For several decades, Outfitters and Guides have been coordinating with the Bruneau Field Office to conduct commercially guided big game hunts on BLM-managed land. There are typically one to two applicants per year, which take place over multiple game units in the field office. California Desert Bighorn sheep tags in Idaho are considered a once in a life time opportunity for many of these hunters.

Since the Spring of 2022, the BLM has authorized a local Boise International Baccalaureate school to conduct an organized bike packing event on or near The Owyhee Uplands Backcountry Byway. Typically, the event is held over the course of 3 days with 25 students and group leaders. Riders participate in a variety of activities including hiking, biking, and camping, as well as learning about wilderness and leave no trace ethics.



The Bruneau FO is leveraging the Idaho Strategic Recreation Fund in FY24 and FY25 as matching funds for an Idaho Parks & Recreation grant. The \$80,000 grant will provide interpretative educational panels, upgraded fencing, basalt columns for the classroom and a road upgrade to the classroom at Perjue Canyon, which is adjacent to the Little Jacks Creek Wilderness. Other partners providing matching funds and volunteer hours include The Wilderness Society, Backcountry Horsemen of Idaho, Sierra Club, Idaho Trails Association, and Idaho Conservation League. The Bruneau Field Office receives about \$1,000-2,000 annually from 3-5 special recreation permit
