Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks (KKTR) National Monument was closed for Fiscal Year 2024 and BLM collected no visitor fees to the Monument. In March of 2024, the Rio Puerco Field Office (RPFO), Albuquerque District Office (ADO), and the New Mexico State Office (NMSO) concluded a year-long coordinated effort to fully implement a Title IV, 638 multi-year funding agreement with Pueblo de Cochiti.

BLM Ticket Reservation + Tribal Access Pass
Check-in at Cochiti Visitor Center
All Tickets available in-advance only; no on-site sales
8 am - 1 pm

(1) Check-in at the Cochiti Visitor Center
Present & scan Tribal Access Pass in Cochiti Visitor Center.
Wait for Cochiti Pilot Vehicle to guide each group of vehicles to the Monument.

(2) Display BLM Ticket Reservation (purchased through Rec.gov)
Pilot Vehicle will guide visitors to and from Cochiti Visitor Center to the fee booth.
Rangers will scan BLM ticket reservation receipt at the entry booth.

(3) Continue on to the Monument and enjoy your visit!
Last visitors will be guided into the Monument at 1 pm and must leave the Monument by 4 pm.
Cochiti Pilot Vehicles will lead visitors back to the Visitor Center (unless in case of emergency).

New process to visit the monument.

Amount Expended: \$13,069.57

For the entirety of Fiscal Year 2024, the RPFO worked together with ADO, NMSO and BLM's National Recreation Team to coordinate the administrative, operational and communications work for RPFO and Pueblo de Cochiti to reopen the Monument. This required BLM to fund several extensive cleaning operations for the Monuments' vault toilets, replace signs on the trails and provide uniforms and specialized training to the Park Rangers (employees of Pueblo de Cochiti) necessary to welcome visitors back to the Monument.

- Planned activities to reopen in February of 2025 (following seasonal closure):
- Implement the Title IV, 638 multi-year funding agreement with Pueblo de Cochiti (Pueblo) for 2025 (circa January 2025)
 - Road maintenance
 - Parking lot maintenance, repair cracked concrete edges of sidewalks (\$5,000)
 - Trail maintenance and repair through local youth corps
 - Vault toilet pumping (\$5,000)
 - Implementation new way to track vehicles and individual visitor numbers via Rec.gov for visitor reservations and collection of fees
 - Finalize Monument Business Plan.
 - Computer/phone for Park Ranger and ORP assigned to KKTR NM (\$1,200)
 - Cleaning supplies (\$300)
 - Annual Fire Extinguisher service (\$500)
